### A. Impacts of Major Extension Programs by Role Statement

#### Family and Consumer Sciences (60%)

##### Children/Youth/Families at Risk

Created a two-day Conference on Children and Family, which will be repeated as an annual event. A culturally diverse audience of 126 participants learned practical skills for improving family life. Surveys asked participants to list:

1. Three things they learned from conference presenters. Some responses: “Spend time with your kids; don’t ever give up; let others help you!!”
2. How they would use this new knowledge. Some responses: “I will think about my reactions . . . and put reason back into my thoughts so I can ‘lose it’ less.”
3. Another participant wrote, “It [the conference] influenced me a lot, because I am struggling at the time.”

Developed a two-day END Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Conference to promote public awareness of family violence and enhance cultural competency for family service providers.

1. Those attending included 106 professional service providers and college nursing students.
2. Participants came from four states, including two Indian reservations.
3. Facilitated presentations included: cultural competency, Native wellness traditions, laws, and medical implications of abuse.
4. Taught one workshop on “Victims, Perpetrators, and Taking Care of Yourself.”
5. Exit surveys demonstrated a high rate of program satisfaction, and gave feedback which will guide future annual conferences.

Facilitated personal safety training for women and girls in San Juan County by inviting an officer from the Utah County Sheriff’s Office to teach Rape Aggression Defense in four San Juan County communities.

1. Participants consisted of 147 girls and 32 women in 4 high schools and 1 community center.
2. Participants learned multiple skills to enhance safety and well being.
3. Self assessment surveys demonstrated new skills acquired (i.e., “be more aware of my surroundings;” “scream and run;” “think about it before it happens, to be prepared”).

4. One student wrote: “I think this is a great program and it has helped me a lot to know what to do. Thank you.”

#### **4-H/Youth Development (35%)**

Youth and Families with Promise (YFP). Administered the Youth and Families with Promise in San Juan County from June, 2005 through September, 2006. Youth referred to the program were paired with volunteer role models through one-to-one mentoring.

1. Using funds totaling \_\_\_\_\_, an average of 2 monthly activities were held at three sites: Blanding, Montezuma Creek, and Monument Valley.
2. Trained 3 site coordinators.
3. Each site carried 25 at-risk youth and 25 mentors.
4. Surveys are currently being evaluated by Utah State University to determine impacts.

4-H Leader Development. Acquired \$2,353 for 4-H Volunteer Development. These funds will be used to recruit and train potential volunteer leaders. Funding will also purchase curriculum to be used by new leaders.

4-H Youth Development. Assisted with 6 county 4-H programs, including 2 sewing camps, 2 style reviews and 2 county fair booths, receiving 198 exhibits. Also judged 4-H portfolios for state contests, and judged 4-H exhibits at the 2006 Utah State Fair.

#### **Research and Scholarship (10%)**

Strong Marriages in two Northern Chapters of the Navajo Nation. Contributed to support documentation, as Co-Principal Investigator, and participated in 2 presentations before the Navajo Nation Human Research Review Board in Window Rock, Arizona. Study findings are complete, and negotiations with the Board regarding proper dissemination of research findings is ongoing.
