Laceration - chin

Disposition - Discharge from ED: home . Condition: stable . The patient is to follow up with , if not improving. . Recheck immediately for new or worsening symptoms. . Chief Complaint

Chief complaint/quote: Pt was running on hardwood floors with socks on and fell down and cut her chin.

Additional info pertinent to Chief Complaint: Pt has small laceration to chin measuring approximately 1cm long.

Provider Evaluation

History of Present Illness

HPI: This is a 2 yo female that presents to the urgent care after sustaining a superficial laceration to her chin. She was at grandma's house and took a ground level fall impacting her chin on the kitchen floor. There was no LOC and she cried immediately. There was no dental trauma and her behavior has been normal since the time of the accident.

There were no other injuries associated with this event. She is healthy and her immunizations are UTD.

Review of Systems

Physical Exam

SKIN: there is a 0.5 cm laceration located on the chin; no gross contamination noted; the bottom of the wound was visualized in a bloodless

field and there was no evidence of foreign bodies; no deep structures appeared injured

NEURO: motor and sensation function were normal surrounding the laceration

CARDIOVASCULAR: pulses were intact; skin surrounding the injury was pink with normal capillary refill; no uncontrolled arterial bleeding

MUSCULOSKELETAL: no bony tenderness at site of injury; tendon function intact
